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ABOUT UNIVERSITY

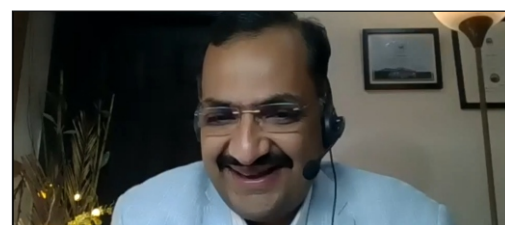

TEACHING LEARNING CENTRE (TLC@CURaj)

Teaching Learning Centre (TLC@CURaj) at Central University of Rajasthan was established in the year 2017-18 with a vision to support evidence-based teaching and provides diverse opportunities for teachers. It is funded by Ministry of Education, Govt. of India under the Scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT). It is envisaged to help teachers to modernize their teaching style and inculcating, innovative and effective pedagogical practices, so that they can impart concepts and information in a meaningful and interesting way among the learners to help them to learn more deeply and effectively. TLC@CURaj completed nearly 3 years and organized successfully 19 programs (workshops/induction programs/refresher courses) in multiple disciplines (Education, Statistics, Science, Computer Science and Management etc.). A total number of 1090 teachers successfully participated in these workshops and other programs from the different parts of India organized by TLC@CURaj.

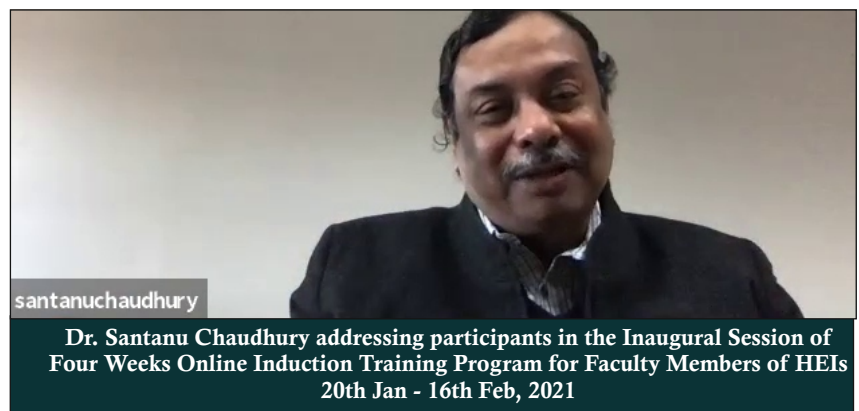
