Items for Consideration

35-4.1 Minutes of the 28th Meeting of the Finance Committee.

The 28th meeting of the Finance Committee of Central University of Rajasthan was held on 23rd June 2019 in the Meeting Room (First Floor), Administrative Building, Central University of Rajasthan campus. The minutes of the Finance Committee meeting are placed before the Executive Council (**Annexure D**) [**Page No. : 37 to 46**].

Placed before the Executive Council for consideration

Resolution: The Finance Officer informed that during the financial year 2018-19, a sum of Rs.1400.00 lakhs was allocated by the UGC under the Budget Head- Capital which is to be incurred up to 30.09.2019. However, due to late receipt of grant and implementation of code of conduct (due to Lok Sabha Election), there will be a liability of Rs. 1175.00 lakhs approx. towards purchase order already placed/ under process and certain quotations/ tenders are under process for purchase of capital item. The Executive Council member noted the same. With this, the Executive Council approved the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

35-4.2 Fact Finding Committee Report in respect of Central University of Rajasthan received from MHRD.

		<p>The MHRD sent a report (Ref.: through its Letter No. 48-5/2015 Desk(U) dated 20.06.2019) of the Fact Finding Committee duly constituted by the University Grants Commission for looking to the allegations of irregularities in fixation of pay and other issues in respect of Central University of Rajasthan. As mentioned in the letter, the matter was examined by the Ministry and the findings/ observations of the Committee have been broadly grouped in to three categories, as follows:</p> <p>Category-I: The irregularities which have been found unsubstantiated on which no follow up action is required;</p> <p>Category-II: The irregularities which have been found substantiated in the finding of the Report of the committee and the University needs to take further action / corrective measures; and</p> <p>Category-III: The irregularities in which the Committee has sought further requisite papers/ documents to substantiate the irregularities.</p> <p>(Will be discussed during the meeting.) Placed before the Executive Council for consideration.</p> <p>Resolution: The Executive Council approved the proposal of the Vice Chancellor to constitute a high power committee, keeping in view the voluminous work and documents. The said Committee may review the documents and give a detailed report which can be then discussed in the future EC meetings. The EC authorized the Vice Chancellor to constitute a committee comprising of two EC members, one FC member and one retired Vice Chancellor of any centrally funded institute. The EC members were of the opinion that internal EC members to be avoided keeping in view the matter being related to various University Officials.</p>
	35-4.3	<p>Inclusion of names in the panel of experts for Selection Committees.</p> <p>The additional name of experts for inclusion in the panel of experts of Selection Committee for teaching position in various Departments is placed for consideration. (The details will be placed on the Table.)</p> <p>Placed before Executive Council for consideration.</p> <p>Resolution: The Executive Council approved the additional name of experts. It was suggested that such names / panel should be routed through Academic Council.</p>
	35-4.4	<p>Establishment of Field Observatory for the Department of Atmospheric Science.</p> <p>A Field Observatory consisting of the basic meteorological instruments is to be established at a suitable location in CURaj for research and training of the students. An area of about 4 acres (150 m x 100 m) behind University Guest House as per the norms laid by WMO is required to be allocated for establishment of Field Observatory for the Department of Atmospheric Science.</p> <p>The matter was placed before the Deans' Committee for consideration and the Deans' Committee in its 64th Meeting at agenda Item No. 64-3.2, agreed to the proposal and recommended that the proposal may be put up in Building Works Committee for recommendation and in Executive Council for approval.</p> <p>The proposal was circulated to Building Works Committee and the Committee approved the proposal.</p> <p>Placed before the Executive Council for consideration.</p>

		Resolution: The Executive Council approved the proposal.
35-4.5	<p>Application of Dr. Nicholas Lakra for joint appointment in Department of Society Technology Interface under the Joint Appointment of Faculty Guidelines.</p> <p>The University has started a new Department namely 'Department of Society Technology Interface' under the School of Social Sciences from the academic year 2018-19. At present two PG programmes (M.Sc. Digital Society, M.A. in Cultural Informatics) are running in the Department, however, no admission took place in M.A. in Cultural Informatics in the current academic year.</p> <p>The University allocated 07 teaching positions (01-Professor, 02-Associate Professor, 04-Assistant Professor) to the Deptt. of Society Technology Interface. The University advertised 03 post of Assistant Professor (01-UR, 01-OBC, 01-SC) vide Advt. No. 757 dated 23-05-2019. At present, some temporary faculty members have been engaged in the Deptt. as per the provisions of Statutes of the University.</p> <p>The Executive Council in its 32nd meeting vide Agenda Item no. 32-5.6 held on 06.07.2018 approved the guidelines for Joint Appointment of Faculty in Central University of Rajasthan and the same was notified vide notification No. 2646 dated 01-10-2018. (Annexure E) [Page No. : 47 to 48].</p> <p>In this connection, an application has been received from Dr. Nicholas Lakra, Assistant Professor, Department of Culture and Media Studies for joint appointment in the Department of Society Technology Interface. Dr. Nicholas Lakra joined the University on 25.07.2013 as Assistant Professor.</p> <p>As per the approved guidelines of the University, the appointing authority of Joint Appointment is the Executive Council. In the instant case, Mr. Lakra may be considered for joint appointment in the Department of Society-Technology Interface under the following clause of approved guidelines: "When a faculty member, who already holds a regular instructional appointment, wants to add an appointment in another School."</p> <p>Placed before the Executive Council for consideration.</p> <p>Resolution: The Executive Council approved the same.</p>

After expiry of the sanctioned leave period, she was supposed to resume her duty on 31.08.2018 in the University. However, before expiry of her CCL, she sent an application dated 28.08.2018 with a request for extension of CCL from 31.08.2018 to 17.01.2019 (140 days) mentioning that she had to look after her daughter (DOB: 1.1.2009) as her mother-in-law was not in position to take care of her daughter in her absence. Mrs. Jesrani had 142 days CCL balance in her leave account as on 31.08.2018.</p> <p>As per the Leave Rules, leave is not a matter or right and CCL is requires prior sanction of Competent Authority. Mrs. Jesrani was directed to report for duty immediately, but she joined the University on 17.01.2019, after intermittent correspondence with the University.</p> <p>A letter dated 25.04.2019 was sent to Mrs. Jesrani to explain her irregular behaviour of not reporting for duty after expiry of sanctioned CCL and being absent from 31.08.2018 to 16.01.2019 without any sanctioned leave. The reply received from Mr. Jesrani was as follows:</p> <p><i>"I again clarify that I could not join the office on 31.08.2018 due to the adverse circumstances of my family. My mother-in-law was suffering from severe illness and no one was in my house to take care of my daughter. So, I was not in position to join the office.
