	31-4.1	To consider the matter of age relaxation of Mrs. Veena Upadhyaya, wife of late Dr. Sunil G. Naik for compassionate appointment
		1. Dr. Sunil G. Naik, Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, Central University of Rajasthan passed away on 30-06-2017. His wife Mrs. Veena Upadhyay submitted a request dated 21-09-2017 for compassionate appointment.
		2. The Vice Chancellor constituted a committee to examine and assess the case of compassionate appointment of Mrs. Veena Upadhyaya as per the Govt. of India/ University norms.
		3. Considering the educational qualifications, experience of Mrs. Upadhyaya and availability of post under Group 'C' in the University, the Committee recommended Mr. Veena Upadhyaya for appointment on the post of Laboratory Assistant under compassionate ground.
		4. The committee observed that as per the University CRR, the upper age prescribed for the post of Laboratory Assistant is 30 years, however her age is 39 years, 2 months and 29 days as on 21-09-2017 that is the date of her application for compassionate appointment.
		5. The committee stated that as per the provisions specified in compassionate appointment guidelines, upper age may be relaxed by the competent authority who has power to make such appointment.
		The matter is placed before Executive Council for relaxation of age of Mrs. Veena Upadhyaya for appointment under compassionate ground.
		Placed before Executive Council for consideration
		Resolution : Executive Council approved the recommendations of the committee for appointment of Mrs. Veena Upadhyay as Laboratory Assistant on compassionate ground with relaxation of age. Executive Council resolved that the age relaxation in the present case is on humanitarian ground as one time measure and should not be cited as precedence. Executive Council reiterated that this consideration is for the specific case only.
	31-4.2	Draft Guidelines for determining the seniority of teachers
		The University has prepared draft guidelines for determining the inter-se-seniority of teachers in the University keeping in view the provisions of Central Universities Act, 2009, UGC and GOI guidelines issued in this regard from time to time.
		The draft guidelines are attached herewith as (Annexure - B Page 30).
		Placed before Executive Council for consideration
		Resolution : Executive Council approved the draft guidelines for determining the seniority of teachers as under: -
		1. Subject to the provisions contained in the following clauses:
		(a) seniority of teachers appointed under direct recruitment shall be determined with reference to the date of joining in the University and
		(b) seniority for teachers promoted under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) shall be determined with reference to the date of eligibility / promotion recommended by the Selection Committee.
		(i) Provided that if the date of appointment/promotion of two or more teachers in a department is the same through same selection, their seniority shall be determined on the basis of the order of merit recommended by the same Selection Committee.

	(ii) Provided further that in other cases, if both the date of appointment/ promotion to be the same, the seniority in age shall be given priority.
	2. The seniority of the teachers whose services are obtained on deputation will be counted from the date they are permanently absorbed in the service of the University.
	3. The period of appointment of teachers on ad-hoc basis shall not be counted for the purpose of seniority unless such appointment had been made on the recommendations of a Selection Committee constituted under Statute 18(2) or appointment has been made in regular term by following any other clause laid down in Statutes and Ordinances and is followed without break by a regular appointment to the same post.
	4. The period of appointment under various projects in the University sponsored by outside agencies shall not be taken into account for determining their seniority.
31-4.3	UGC letter No. F.1-5/2006 (SCT) dated 05 March, 2018 regarding implementation of Reservation Policy of the Govt. of India.
	The UGC vide its letter dated 05 March, 2018 (Annexure-C From Page 31 to 34) has amended the following clauses of earlier UGC guidelines issued for implementation of reservation policy.
	"(i) <u>Clause 6(c):</u>
	In case of reservation for SC/ST, all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grant-in-Aid Institutions and Centres shall prepare the roster system keeping the Department/ Subject as a unit for all level of teachers as applicable.
	(ii) <u>Clause 8(a)(v):</u> The roster, department-wise/ subject-wise, shall be applied to the total number of posts in each of the categories [(e.g.) Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor] within the Department / Subject."
	The UGC requested to prepare fresh rosters within one month of receipt of the letter dated 05-03-2018 under intimation to UGC. In this connection, the University has prepared reservation roster for the each category i.e. Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor for each department separately.
	As per the new reservation policy, the vacant teaching positions have been earmarked category-wise and the list is attached (Annexure-D) for consideration.

	Resolution : Executive Council approved the Reservation Roster. Executive Council authorized the Vice Chancellor, to make any minor correction in case arises in future. It is also resolved that complete roster list and roster for vacant positions be separately prepared and circulated along with minutes of this meeting ¹ . Executive Council further resolved that the matter be intimated to UGC as required by UGC. Executive Council also resolved that the vacant positions shall be re-advertised as per new reservation roster as previously
	advertised teaching positions are no longer valid due to change of Reservation Policy/Roster.

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Placed before Executive Council for consideration **Resolution**: The addition of the names of experts in the list of panel of experts, as proposed, was approved by the Executive Council. It was also resolved by the Executive Council that whenever the need arises, the Vice Chancellor is authorized to add names in the Panel of Experts for Selection Committee(s) and also to prepare the panel of experts for the new departments like Sports and Yoga. To invite a person as faculty member in academic department under 31-4.5 Statute 19 of Central Universities Act, 2009. The post of Professor and Associate Professor of the Academic Departments advertised by the University at least more than two or three times under Direct Recruitment, however, no candidate was found suitable and eligible for several Departments. To strengthen the Department, at least one senior faculty member is required. Hence, some senior faculty members may be invited on contractual basis against the available vacant position in the Department. The Statues-19, Central Universities Act, 2009 states that "Notwithstanding anything contained in statue 18, the Executive Council may invite a person of high academic distinction and professional attainments to accept a post of Professor or Associate Professor or any other equivalent academic post in the university on such terms and conditions as it deems fit and on the person agreeing to do so appoint him to the post." Provided that the Executive Council may create upto five percent supernumerary posts for a specified period for appointment of such persons". 31-4.5.1 Appointment of Dr. Manas Patra as faculty in the Department of Computer Science. 31-4.6 Manner of appointment of Adjunct faculty in the University.

The procedure for appointment of Adjunct Faculty, honorarium / emoluments and maximum number of adjunct faculty to be appointed at any given time have been mentioned in University Ordinance – 37.

These Ordinances were made more than five years ago.

We need to have more number of good quality adjunct faculty members to develop this University as a World Class University. Hence, the present emoluments and limit on number of Adjunct Faculty will not be relevant. The emoluments may commensurate with the experience and expertise of the Adjunct Faculty to be invited / appointed.

Hence Executive Council may consider revising the emoluments payable and limitation on maximum number of Adjunct faculty to be appointed at any given time.

Resolution: Executive Council recommended that the Ordinance 37 for appointment of Adjunct Faculty should be revised and should be **one Adjunct Faculty per school.**

Appointment of Dr. Anirban Chattopadhyay as Adjunct faculty in the Department of Public Policy, Law and Governance.

The detailed C.V. of Dr. Anirban Chhttopadhyay is attached herewith as *(Annexure-K Page 98)*.
